After all the turmoil experienced 15 months ago I am pleased to be able to say that the BAASDC Council is functioning normally.

Arrangements have been made for the BAASDC 70th Birthday Celebrations in Rugby in July 2023. Friday 21st sees Di Green and Kevin Lovell calling and Judi Read cuing. During the day on the Saturday 22nd there will be multi level dancing in two halls. Saturday evening is a Gala Dance with Paul Bristow and Neil Whiston calling and Terresa Hart cuing.

The financial problems that clubs faced as a result of Covid pandemic show no sign of ending. Just as they are recovering from their effects rising energy costs are pushing up the cost of hall hire (up to 50% in some cases) which is leading to increased pressure on club finances

The effects of Covid and the subsequent lockdowns have had a devastating effect on UK square and round dancing. In the last two years over 25% of clubs (at 2020 level) have closed and others are only just surviving on just over a square of dancers meaning regular dancing is not possible. Taking this into account along with the age profile of our callers it would seem that we must expect more closures over the next few years.

Along with the Square Dance Callers Club of Great Britain, BAASDC is trying to promote the use of social media as a recruitment tool, it having proved very successful where it has been piloted.

At the dance DAASDC and 'Hedens Squaredansere' drew attention to both the Danish Convention 2023 and the European Convention 2024. TAIWAN

Dear fellow dancers.

The pandemic is not yet over this year in Taiwan. It has been enormously affecting our daily lives. Although more than 85% of the population have received at least two doses of COVID-19 vaccines, the numbers of domestic confirmed cases started to soar in April, 2022. Most SD clubs had called off routine activities since then. Accordingly, the SDAROC's Spring Party, originally organized to be held on 17, April was cancelled. SD Clubs reopened gradually in July.

It is with great sadness that we announce the sudden death of Mr. Huber Ho in July, 2022. Huber was a wonderful gentleman with an incredible passion for square dance. He had been leading the Metro Taipei SD Club for more than 20 years, and was the most important and beloved caller and club leader in Taiwan. Huber played an important role in the developing of Taiwan's square dance and had laid a solid foundation of calling and teaching that many Taiwanese callers and dancers benefitted from. It is such a great loss for all of us.

Usually, the SDAROC holds four joint parties each year, partial membership will be refund if this goal is not met. So far only two parties have been organized this year. On 24, July Ms. Beral Shen called for a general assembly the day after Huber's funeral. She was re-elected as the chairperson of the SDAROC for another term. A session of the afterparty was dedicated to Huber and his recorded calling tips were played in memory of his contributions. The second party was a Thanks-Giving Party, held on 6, November. Less than 50 percents of the members took part in these two events. Low participation rate implies that most dancers still don't feel comfortable with the mass

gathering. This concern has to be alleviated before dancers go back to the dance floor.

But every cloud has a silver lining. In this year, Andrea Cheng and Nancy Chen, leaders of Ant Squares and TWTC respectively, started to introduce SSD (Social Square Dance) to the new dancers. This is a great jump-start for potential dancers to have a quick glance before they dig into the beauty of square dance. The alteration is indeed expanding a broader base for SD teaching in Taiwan. On the other hand, a few dancers were invited by the Polly Wally Club to start a journey to C3B learning this February. Polly Wally is a club of C3A and B, its members are from various clubs. It is a rare opportunity to have openings for new members. Recordings have been used as teaching materials, and more experienced dancers have been playing the role as angels for the new comers. Team effort makes the learners less stressful and gives angels times to review calls again, it is truly a winwin situation.

Furthermore, Murphy Chang, leader of Clover Fun Squares, has been organizing SQ FUN, a series of inter-club party, twice a month if situation permits. Dancers pay for thickets and enjoy a Saturday morning dancing from levels Plus to A2. SQ FUN allows us to dance regularly and readily besides the joint parties. In addition, Grace Su, leader of Cheng-Kung, started to adopt the 2-couple square in teaching.

With 4 phantoms in a square, dancers need to be more aware of the definitions, the formations, and the relationships with phantoms, etc. It takes a great deal of concentration and brain power and hence makes dancing even more challenging and fascinating.

There are no any square dancers suffered by the epidemic reported luckily in Beijing up to now because of we put on the masks and adhere to nucleic acid once within 72 hours and avid to visit the medium and high risk area including we could not be possible to go abroad to join any international square dance conventions.









Our communities organized nucleic acid testing in an orderly manner nearby the residences, and I served as one of volunteers to maintain the orders (as the photos above).

There are very strong bases of square dances involved by millions of old, middle-aged and young dancers in China with various of 56 multiple nationalities. The leadership of Beijing Smile Club, one of the most active clubs in Beijing makes use of the chance to create the square dance with local cultural. We had more than 80 people dance together under the help of the famous callers of Toru Ogami from Japan, Brain from Australia and Joachim Ruehenbeck from Germany in recent years (The Group SQD photos as below).

We would like to emphasize that the large-scale team dance exhibition of China Smile Club shows the Chinese characteristics, the wisdom and ability of Chinese people, the innovative cognition of square dance group, the effort and contribution. The club realized that the construction of the organization team could not be separated from a batch of new recruits. The Group Square Dance can show the comprehensive coordination ability of dance personnel at all levels.
